Future Developments

Next season the main Home fixture will be against Wales at Twickenham on Saturday 9th April.

Fixtures between England and Wales at schoolboy level began in 1904 and have been played on a regular basis since. This is the oldest international schoolboy fixture and many famous players from both sides of "Offa's Dyke" have played in it.

The match will be part of a Schools Day at Twickenham. Apart from the International the finals of the Daily Mail Schools Cups will also be played. The Daily Mail Cups have been in operation for several years. There are two competitions for individual schools at Under 18 and Under 15.

Castlecroft

Originally built as a training ground for Wolverhampton Wanderers FC in 1950, Castlecroft saw a long period of decline as the fortunes of the famous "Wolves" slipped further into the past.

The state of the original stand deteriorated and the pitch was used less and less. Bob Cheetham, the chairman of Wolverhampton Rugby Club recognised that there was an opportunity for development and he eventually persuaded the Rugby Football Union to take an interest.

At the same time both the 16 Group and 18 Group were expanding their activities, moving to a divisional championship structure rather than a single round of games. The advent of leagues meant that clubs were not always able to allow use of their facilities so the schools were in need of a permanent home.

In 1990 agreement was reached with the local authorities and the RFU took over the lease. In September of that year Ron Tennick, Assistant Technical Administrator and Schools Secretary moved from Twickenham to Wolverhampton. The old stand was demolished and a new one, containing offices, lecture room, a weight training area as well as changing accommodation and treatment rooms was built.

Ready for occupation in September 1991, the RFU's centre for Schools and Youth was opened officially by the President of the Rugby Football Union, Peter Yarranton.

Although designated for Schools and Youth many different groups have already made use of these fine facilities. The 16 Group have already played an international against Italy here. The Under 21 have played the Belgian national side. The 18 Group will be playing Scotland here on Saturday 3rd of April. The Senior England squad have also had a training weekend at the centre. The semi finals of the Daily Mail cups will also be played here over the weekend 20/21st March. The adjoining Castlecroft Hotel has been redeveloped jointly by the RFU and Tarmac so accommodation is on the doorstep.

The schools in particular are pleased to have their own Twickenham even if it is called Castlecroft and look forward with confidence to a rosy future.
