

### JENNIFER ANNE SHEERIN


### 50th CAP

Today is a special day for Jeni and for Scottish women's rugby. For today, sees Jeni achieve her 50th cap, an amazing individual achievement and one which is testimony to her outstanding abilities as a rugby player and to the integral part she has played in the development and successes of the Scottish women's rugby team over the past nine season. And she's only 27!!

Heriot Watt gave birth to the player who has become a recognised formidable force on the playing field by team mates and oppositions alike. It all started in December 1992, when she was selected to represent Scottish Select against the North East Region of England, playing alongside fellow future internationalists such as Kim Littlejohn, Sue Brodie, Anny Freitas, and Lee Cockburn...but back then it was on the wing!! It's ironic that five years later, following Scotland's 28-3 win over Ireland in February 1997 an article in the Scotlman was comparing her to another famous number 11, Vaiga Tuigamala, stating that "at the centre of everything was Richmond flanker Jeni Sheerin, an outrageously powerful individual who was compared by some Irish supporters to Tuigamala. There is one noticeable difference... Sheerin is fitter and harder!". You're no wrong there!

Fortunately, wing became wing forward and the rest is history. She has maintained her back row selection in the first XV over the past eight seasons and has represented Scotland in the Home and Five Nations Championships and at three European Championships (1997, 1999 and 2000) and at two World Cups in 1994 and 1998, and no doubt will form part of the squad going to Spain for the next Women's Rugby World Cup in May 2002. In 2000, she was voted the Best Player in England, again another recognition of her outstanding performance. If I could have wished for one thing it was to have the room full of Scottish players when the announcement was made that the best player in England was a Scotswoman!!

Jeni, from past and present coaches, players, physios, managers, the SWRU, and for the fly halves that fear you lurking in the shadows, for those who have suffered the misforturne of hearing and being below your infamous cry 'RUCK!' we're whoelheartedly glad that you have been on our side! Thank you for the rampant runs, the pounding big hits, the power and pace, and the excitement of it all. Long may it continue. Have a truly great day Jennifer Anne Sheerin.


