Mark DAVIES (Swansea, Captain) Aged 26. 6ft 2ins. 14st. 4lbs. Wales 'B' twice in 1981. Senior caps— Australia 1981, Ireland 1982. Wales 'B' to Spain in 1983. Physiotherapist.

Geraint JOHN (S.G.I. Vice-Captain) Aged 23. 5ft 9ins. 11st. 9lbs. 3 Welsh Schools Under 19 caps in 1980. Completes 4th year at S.G.I. this summer. Welsh and British Colleges, Welsh Unies and Ba-Baas. 12 points for Wales 'B' in their first win in France last season. Student and hopes to go to Cambridge next season.

Martin GRAVELLE (Llanelli) Aged 25. 5ft 8½ ins. 11st. 5lbs. 153 points for Llanelli this season (13 tries). Wales 'B' against France 1981 and has played against New Zealand, the Maoris and Australia for his club. A fine cricketer, he captained Welsh Schools U-19 and played for Young England. A pharmacist.

Ieuan DAVIES (Llanelli) Aged 20. 5ft. 9ins. 12st. 3lbs. Newcomer to first class rugby this season, and reputed to be fastest wing in Wales. 10 tries to date. Hong Kong Sevens with Crawshaw's last month. Played for Welsh Universities students. Student at Salford University.

Steve CRANDON (Newbridge) Aged 20. 5ft 9ins. 12st. 7lbs. Product of St. Cyres School, Penarth. A member of the Grand Slam Welsh Schools U-18 side of 1983. Moved to Newbridge this season after a year at Penarth. A clerk.

Lee JONES (Pontypool) Aged 26. 5ft. 10ins. 12st. Wales 'B' and National squads this season. 'B' cap against France, scoring try. Over 100 games in four seasons at Pontypool, including 1983 Cup Final against Swansea, and against Australia this season. Technician.

Arthur EMYR (Swansea) Aged 22. 6ft. 2ins. 12st. Scorer of 20 tries this season for Swansea. North Walian who graduated into the Swansea side from Aberystwyth University. Scored a try against Australia for his Club. Works in television.

Mark DOUGLAS (London Welsh) Aged 24. 6ft. 13st. Capped 3 times for Wales last season after serving as a replacement 8 times. Welsh Schools U-15 cap and Wales 'B' Tour to Spain 1983. Joined London Welsh from Llanelli and played against New Zealand Maoris. Slaughterman.

Tim JONES (London Welsh) Aged 26. 5ft. 10ins. 13st. 7lbs. Came into the Wales 'B' squad last season and a former Oxford 'Blue'. Four seasons with London Welsh. Solicitor.

Steve DAVIES (S. W. Police) Aged 27. 5ft. 8½ ins. 13st. 7lbs. Wales U-19 Cap. Joined S. W. Police from Swansea. Police Constable.

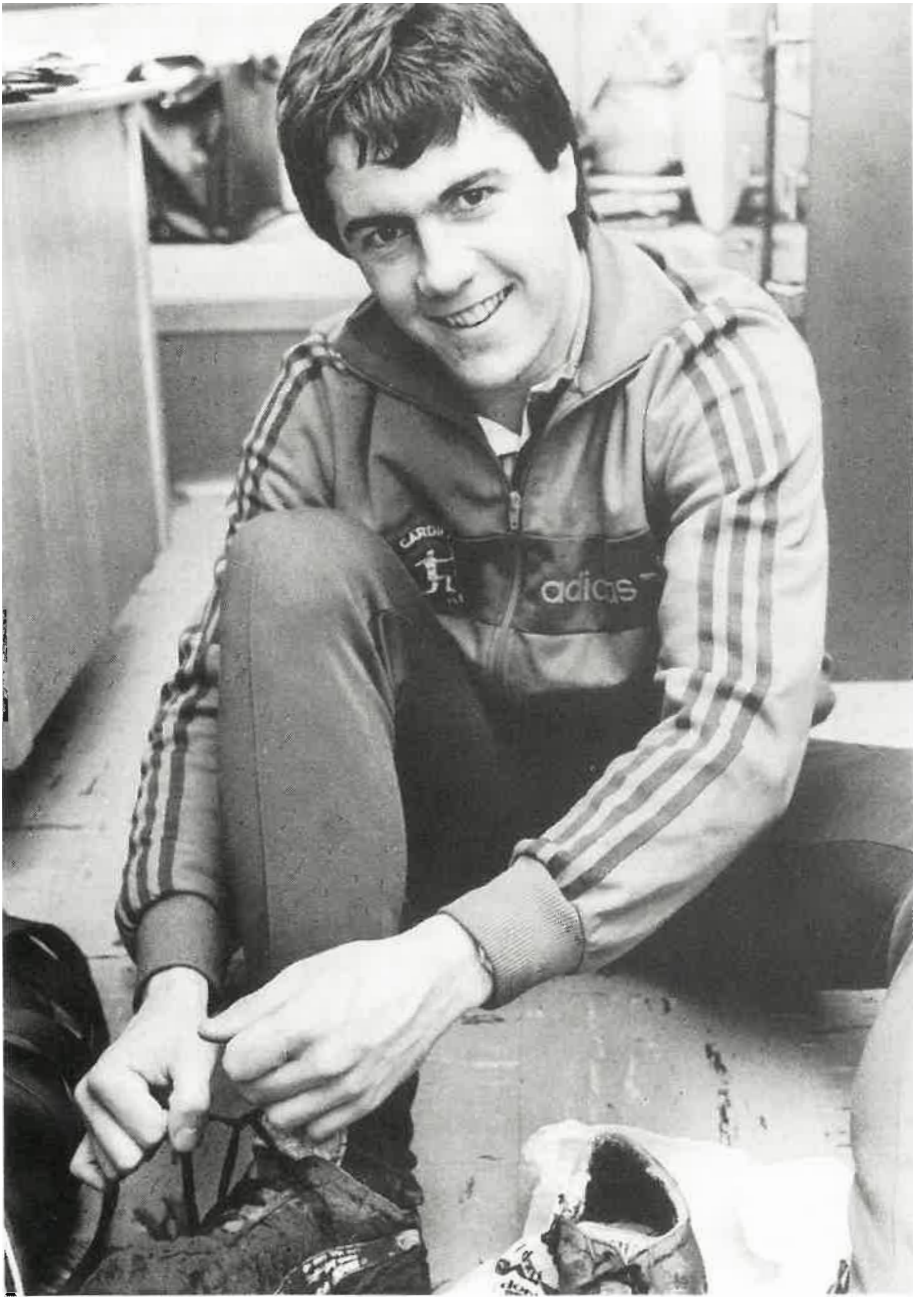

David WATERS (Newport) Aged 29. 6ft. 6½ ins. 16st. Picked twice for Wales this season, but both times missed out on a full cap. Wales 'B' against France this season. Barbarian. More than 300 games for his Club. Truck Driver.

Kevin MOSELEY (Pontypool) Aged 20. 6ft. 7ins. 15st. 10lbs. In his second full season with Pontypool and already a National squad member. Wales 'B' cap against France this season. Printer.

BAND OF THE SOUTH WALES CONSTABULARY

The Band was formed in May 1981 in order to enhance police/public relations, to support official police parades and similar functions, and to provide a facility for amateur music-making by members of the force.

It comprises of regular police officers serving throughout the three counties of Glamorgan and includes all ranks from constable to chief inspector. Members retain their primary role as operational police officers, with band duty becoming a secondary and oft-times additional responsibility. The Corps of Drums provides an additional dimension to the Band and are fast becoming a feature in marches, displays and concert programmes.

The Band receives no money from public funds, but can truly claim to have contributed to the furtherance of police/public relations. Always in demand, we have been pleased to assist many charities and hope to continue this work in the future.

The Band is fortunate in having as its Honorary Director of Music, Mr. Colin Evans, who is an assistant chief constable in the force. Mr. Evans' musical career started at the age of seven when he commenced playing with the Salvation Army Brass Band at Paignton, Devon and has continued throughout service with the Royal Air Force and with a variety of musical combinations. He joined the police service in 1956 and rose through the ranks to become the Chief Superintendent in charge of the Exeter Police Division. He was a founder member and Band Officer of the Band of the Devon and Cornwall Constabulary, so it is small wonder that upon his appointment to the South Wales Constabulary on 1st October, 1980 one of his first discussions with the Chief Constable should have concerned the formation of the Band which performs for you today.
